

## **SIQUIJOR STATE COLLEGE MAJOR PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS 2015**

Historically, Siquijor State College (SSC) has been in existence since 1983 as the Larena National Vocational College when Parliamentary Bill No. 1303 authored by then Assemblyman Dominador Pernes which was approved by the National Assembly as Batas Pambansa Blg. 387. On March 3, 1995, the institution became a state college by virtue of the passage of House Bill No. 412 which was approved into law as Republic Act No. 7949 by then President Fidel V. Ramos.

Siquijor State College as one of the higher educational institutions funded by the state, devotes its authentic concern on the attainment of its goals while adapting and addressing the urgent demands of the times. The challenge to provide a promising future to the 2,742 students is a gigantic yet noble task considering the dwindling budgetary allocations for state colleges and universities. Such behooves school leadership to put emphasis on discovering innovative measures without jeopardizing its academic priorities. In its desire to pursue the thrusts of higher education, the College has adopted a paradigm shift in its operation, policies, and procedures just to put the institution on the niche of higher educational excellence.

#### **A.1 STATUS OF IMPLEMENTATION**

The extension projects and activities were conducted by the different colleges with different clienteles in the province of Siquijor for the calendar year 2015.

#### **A.2 COLLEGES/DEPARTMENTS PARTICIPATION TO EXTENSION SERVICES**

At the six (6) departments of Siquijor State College are required to conduct Extension Services to communities/barangays in terms of literacy, skills enhancement and livelihood development. This is

SSC's commitment in poverty alleviation through helping the community to improve their way of living through providing skills development and livelihood programs.

### **A.3 STATUS OF COLLEGES/DEPARTMENTS PARTICIPATION TO EXTENSION SERVICES**

For the year 2015, the Extension Department of Siquijor State College was able to extend services to seven (14) different barangays and a total of 1236 beneficiaries/clienteles for the different extension services provided.

### **B. SCHOLARSHIPS PROGRAMS**

The Siquijor State College adheres firmly to the principle that poverty is not a hindrance in the quest of quality education and that financially challenged individual can still acquire the best quality education through the availment of scholarship programs and grants. Thus, for the year 2015 SSC through the Office of the Student Personnel Welfare and Services offers various scholarship program and grants.

#### **1. Academic/Honor Scholarship Grant**

Description: a scholarship granted to valedictorians and salutatorians coming from a high school graduating class, college students who qualified for dean's honor scholarship, class honors and college honors with 50 to 100 free tuition fee.

**2. Cultural and Athletics Scholarship** which consists of 100% free tuition is awarded to students who are regular members of the different cultural organization and sports events who have shown excellent performance.

**3. Barangay Health Worker – One Child Policy Scholarship** is a scholarship program initiated by the Department of Health which grants scholarship to children of barangay health workers. Grantees are given 100% tuition and miscellaneous fees.

**4. Barangay Scholarship** which consists of 100% free tuition and matriculation fee is awarded to children of barangay officials during the time of their incumbency, provided that all necessary requirements for the said scholarships per CHED Order No. 30 s.2005 and SSC BOT Resolution No. 5 s. 2006 are complied with.

**5. Divine Mercy Assistance Foundation Scholarship Program** is a scholarship program sponsored by Rev. Filmore Calibo who is based in Zamboanga City. Grantees are given free tuition and miscellaneous fees.

**6. Expanded Students' Grant-In-Aid Program for Poverty Alleviation (ESGP-PA)** – Grantees of this program are poor but deserving students giving priority to Pantawid Pamilya beneficiaries qualified to enroll in selected SUCs to take up priority programs of CHED and other course offerings aligned



with the government key growth areas per CMO No. 1 series 2014 “CHED Priority Courses for AY 2014-2015 to AY 2017-2018.

- 7. Gabay Guro Scholarship Program (2G Scholarship Program)** – The grant shall be established to provide full tuition support and stipend to scholars who enrolled in BS Education courses preferably majoring in English, Science and Mathematics. Initially, there shall be five (5) 2g grantees. The grant is available to each grantee from the start of their freshman year in the University/College up to a maximum of four (4) years as specified by the College/University catalog for the undergraduate degree program sought by the student.
- 8. Grant in-Aid (GIA)** This is intended for
  - a. Graduating high school students whose GWA is at least a passing grade in the third year and in the first three grading periods of the fourth year and who will enroll in the identified priority courses in duly authorized public or private HEIs.
  - b. With earned units in college whose weighted average is at least a passing grade for the last two (2) semesters and enrolled in identified priority courses in duly authorized public or private HEIs.
  - c. Who passed the Alternative Learning System (ALS) and Philippine Education Placement Test (PEPT).
- 9. Municipality of Larena Scholarship** is scholarship granted to qualified students who are residents of the municipality of Larena Screening and Selection is through the office of the municipality mayor of Larena.
- 10. One-Town One Scholarship Program** is a scholarship grant in accordance with the pertinent provisions of republic Act (RA) No. 777, otherwise known as the “Higher Education Act of 1994: the One-Town, One Scholar” Scholarship program shall be a separate, special program under the umbrella of the CHED Scholarship Program. The grantees is given free tuition fees.
- 11. PAFSA – Parents, Faculty and Staff Association Scholarship** is open to all children of PAFSA members whose average grades is not less than 85% in all subjects and is not enjoying any other scholarship program. The scholarship is entitled to 100% free tuition and miscellaneous fees.
- 12. Programang Agraryo Iskolar (PAI) Scholarship** is a scholarship granted to poor but deserving students. Selection of scholars is through DAR Qualified scholars are 100% free of tuition and miscellaneous fees
- 13. SSC FASA (Faculty and Academic Staff Association) Study Grant**

Extends free tuition fees and other fees to the wife/husband and a maximum of four legitimate children of permanent full-time faculty members, who have served continuously for a period of not less than two years in the college, subject to renewal from semester to semester if they pass in at least 12 units or  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the total units enrolled in.

**14. SSCAA – Siquijor State College Alumni Association Scholarship** is a scholarship program sponsored by the Alumni Association of SSC Scholars are selected from the top ranking students of all the Department/College. Only one scholar for the whole college is given 1 slot of scholarship.

**15. State Scholarship Program (SSP)**

a. Full Scholarship (FS) – Intended for high school graduates whose General Weighted Average (GWA) is at least 90% or its equivalent and for graduating high school students whose GWA is at least 90% or its equivalent in the third year and at least 90% in the first three grading period of the fourth year, who will enroll in identified priority courses in duly authorized public or private HEIs.

b. Partial Scholarship (PS) Intended for high school graduates whose General Weighted Average (GWA) is at least 85% or its equivalent and for graduating high school students whose GWA is at least 85% or its equivalent in the third year and at least 85% in the first three grading period of the fourth year, who will enroll in identified priority courses in duly authorized public or private HEIs.
